

Languages, Literacy & Communication

Literacy

Through our topic, the children will use the text *The Flood*, to write about the impact of flooding. They will also create their own stories, look at stories from different cultures and persuasive texts, such as leaflets. The children will also develop their oracy skills by discussing their opinions and exploring their debating skills. They will continue to develop a range of punctuation and spelling patterns.

Welsh

The children will write about their daily routines linking the activities to time. They will explore poetry and create their own family profiles. They will be practicing reading aloud independently and sequencing a dialogue. As part of the topic they will talk about themselves in present and past tense and take part in dialogue about daily routines, pets and family.

Expressive Arts

Art -

The children will create a Waterlilies inspired oil pastille picture, a Georgia O'Keef inspired river drawing and river landscapes using Pointilism. They will also develop their shading and tone skills by completing observational drawings of their view of the River Severn from the school.

Other information:

- PE - Will be every Tuesday. The children will wear PE kit to school.
- Homework: Will be given out on Friday on Dojo and needs to be completed and saved onto the children's Portfolios.
- No reading books will be sent home for the foreseeable future. We will provide the children with passwords for Purple Mash and Oxford Owl. Children will be expected to read regularly and complete set tasks.

Mathematics & Numeracy

The children will consolidate written methods of addition, subtraction, division and multiplication. They will be solving problems involving money and time - timetables and ordering. Throughout the term the children will use decimals in relation to money and develop their numeracy skills using statistics linked to the topic. The children will also complete position and direction skills and properties of shapes. The focus for multiplications will be 3, 4 and 6 times tables. Through our daily math's activities we will also be practicing our number bonds to 1000, place value, fractions and reasoning skills.

They will be learning how to create presentations which include, text, images, sounds and video clips. We will also work collaboratively with classmates on the same document.
