

Languages, Literacy & Communication

Literacy

Through our topic, we will write about the impact of flooding discussing how people cope in the aftermath of such events. We will also create our own stories, look at stories from different cultures and a range of poetry. We will complete a range of comprehension exercises and continue to develop a range of punctuation and spelling patterns.

Welsh

We will write personal profiles, write about where they live and create a brochure. Begin to describe someone else in the third person. Practice reading aloud independently and sequencing a dialogue. Talk about ourselves in present and past tense. To take part in a dialogue and Survey what pupils like doing in the park.

Expressive Arts

Art -

The children will create a Waterlilies inspired oil pastille picture, a Georgia O'Keef inspired river drawing and river landscapes using Pointilism.

Other information:

- PE - Will be every Thursday. The children will wear PE kit to school.
- Homework: Will be given out on Friday on Dojo and needs to be completed and saved onto the children's Portfolios.
- No reading books will be sent home for the foreseeable future. We will provide the children with passwords for Purple Mash and Oxford Owl. Children will be expected to read regularly and complete set tasks.

Mathematics & Numeracy

We will consolidate written methods of addition, subtraction, division and multiplication. We will be solving problems involving money and time - duration and ordering. We will be using Venn & Carroll diagrams, pictograms, tally charts and bar and bar-line graphs in our science and topic work. Through our daily math's activities we will also practice our number bonds to 100, place value, the 2, 3, 4 and 5 times tables, doubling and halving and will revise mental strategies for addition, subtraction multiplication and division.
