

Languages, Literacy & Communication

Literacy

The children will use the text "The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch". The children will explore a variety of activities including:

Creating a diary entry as Mr Grinling.

Write a recipe for lunch.

Explore stories linked to the Welsh culture and poetry.

Develop their oracy skills through role play of the story and retelling the story from the seagull's point of view.

Continue to develop a range of punctuation and spelling/phonetic patterns.

Welsh

The children will use drama to explore a variety of patterns, such as Beth wyt ti hoffi wneud.

They will be practicing reading aloud independently and learning new songs to develop a greater understanding, confidence and performance.

Expressive Arts

Art

Children will explore using natural materials in the forest school area to create coastal scenes. Investigating art from the 1990's linked to Queen's Jubilee.

Music

The children will explore and sing different shanties. This will then be used in dance to create a group performance.

Other information:

- PE - Will be every Tuesday. The children will wear PE kit to school.
- Homework: Will be given out on Friday on Dojo and needs to be completed and saved onto the children's Portfolios the following Wednesday.
- Reading books will be given out on the set days and the children will be listened to and new book given that day.

Mathematics & Numeracy

The children will continue to complete place value activities to develop a secure understanding of the values of number.

Complete written methods of addition, subtraction, division and multiplication. To reinforce this the children will then complete the inverse operation.

2, 3, 4, 5 and 10 times tables.

Use mental recall of number bonds within 10 to derive bonds within 1000, e.g $6 + 4 = 10$, $600 + 400 = 1000$

Halving and doubling using diamonds.

Identifying fractions of number and objects using $1/2$, $1/4$ and $1/3$.

Round numbers to the nearest 10 or 100.

Personal & Social Education

Develop a range of perseverance strategies to use within and outside the class through problem solving tasks linked to Forest School.

Continue to develop mindfulness techniques.
